



Equipment Operator: Transport and Hauling - Skilled

Truck Driver	See different types below.
Job Description	Generally responsible for moving supplies and equipment to various construction sites.
Education/Certification	Although there are no formal education requirements, job readiness and safety training may be helpful. A certificate from the NWT Apprenticeship Board or from Aurora College for heavy equipment operator training (or equivalent) would greatly benefit the candidate. Depending on the truck, the driver will require a Class 1, 2 or 3 driver's licence with air brake endorsement.
Experience	Experience will determine the level of responsibility.
Skills	Needs excellent physical condition, good vision, good eye and hand/foot coordination, mechanical ability and fast reflexes.
Wage Range	\$28 to \$35 per hour
Transferability	Truck drivers are found in many other industries, such as forestry, mining, hydro, gravel yards and construction.

Types of truck operators (similar requirements and wages):

Flat Deck Truck (High Boy) and Low Bed Truck Drivers	Move supplies and equipment to various construction sites.
Fuel Truck Driver	Transports fuels to and from the work site, ensuring the safety of those nearby.
Gravel (Dump) Truck Driver	Delivers granular materials (gravel and rock) to the pipeline corridor.
String Truck Driver	Hauls pipe to the pipeline corridor from the stockpiles. Assists in handling and transporting of materials.
Vacuum Truck Driver	Removes and transports waste materials, such as sewage and contaminants, from construction sites. Should be knowledgeable about the safe handling and disposal of dangerous fluids.
Water Truck Driver	Delivers clean water to construction camps and sites that are on a pump-out system. Operates fill stations and may also flood ice roads and remote river crossings.



Other Transport Position:

Bus Driver

Ensures the safety of all passengers when transporting them to and from the work site. Requires a Class 4 driver's licence that permits the operation of a 25+ passenger bus. Completion of the Aurora College Driving Program or equivalent would be an asset. Wage range: \$28 - \$35 an hour.

Note: These job descriptions represent positions frequently found in large pipeline projects. Appropriate education and experience will play a determining role when selecting candidates. Some positions may require extensive natural gas related expertise. Salaries and wages are based on 2001 data and may change according to market conditions.
